

SECTION 1. California SMART Act (Supervision Modernization, Accountability, Rehabilitation, and Technology).

SEC. 2. Findings.

- (a) Supervision must, on the one hand, balance accountability, rehabilitation, and public safety.
- (b) App-based solutions can make check-ins more efficient and connect individuals with key services such as employment, counseling, and education.
- (c) AI-driven risk assessments can concentrate supervision on those at higher risk and avoid wasting resources on low-risk individuals.

SEC. 3. Program Creation.

Section 3007.5 is added to the Penal Code to read:

3007.5. California SMART Supervision Program.

- (a) The Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, in conjunction with county probation agencies, shall implement app-based case management systems for parolees and probationers to:
  - (1) Report into supervising officers.
  - (2) Utilize employment, counseling, and educational services.
  - (3) Engage securely with supervising officers.
- (b) The department shall utilize AI-driven risk assessments to tailor supervision levels, prioritizing resources for more at-risk individuals.

SEC. 4. Responsibility.

- (a) Data collected shall be utilized only for rehabilitation and supervision.
- (b) An annual report shall be submitted to the Legislature on program outcomes, including recidivism, employment rate, cost savings, and effects on public safety.
